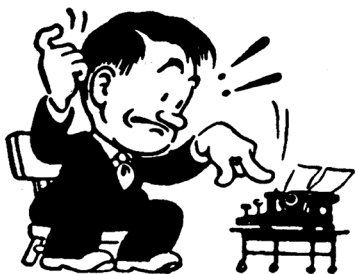
CLOWNS

Flag Day commemorates the adoption of the flag of the United States on June 14th, 1777, by resolution of the Second Continental Congress, introduced by John Adams. The Flag Resolution, passed on June 14th, 1777, stated: "Resolved, That the flag of the thirteen United States be thirteen stripes, alternate red and white; that the union be thirteen stars, white in a blue field, representing a new constellation." In 1916, President Woodrow Wilson issued a proclamation that officially established June 14th as Flag Day; on August 3rd, 1949, National Flag Day was established by an Act of Congress.

Did you know? . . . The United States Army also celebrates the U.S. Army birthday on June 14th; Congress adopted «the American continental army» after reaching a consensus position in the Committee of the Whole on June 14th, 1775. The most well-known June date in military history is June 6, 1944, the Normandy invasion in World War II. It occurred just two days after the U.S. 5 Army liberated Rome. The Pledge of Allegiance was recognized by Congress on June 22nd, 1942. The Soviet military occupation of East Germany ended on June 11th, 1994. The War of 1812 began on June 18th. Congress officially adopted the Great Seal of the United States (with its Masonic symbolism) on June 20th, 1782.
