

RECORDER REMARKS

By Gene McKelvey Nobles your Elected Officers have just returned from the Imperial Council Session. You will find the results of the voting on the resolutions for both Fraternal and Hospital sides of our organization in the center section of this edition of the Ink. One of the main items on the agenda for the meeting was a per capita tax increase. The Per Capita Tax is the portion of your dues that we are required to send to Headquarters to offset the cost of running the fraternal side of our organization. Going into the Session, the Per Capita Tax was \$30.00 per member. The resolution that was presented to us, would have been an additional \$30.00. This is the figure that Headquarters has had in their head for several years now. Your elected officers and many more across the room felt that \$30.00 was excessive and voted it down. Later in the day, that item was brought back up under re-consideration and after much "Discussion" back and forth, the resolution was successfully amended to \$20.00 per member and passed for a very close margin. As increases in Per Capita Tax are automatic when approved, you will see a \$20.00 increase in your next years dues. This will put the dues amount at \$105.00, which is still less expensive than most Temples in the country. With this in mind and since India hasn't fully recovered finewielly from 2 years without a Circum financially from 2 years without a Circus during Covid, we would like to add \$15.00 to that amount for India, making the total amount \$120.00. The \$15.00 for India does require your approval, as it should. With this in mind, we gave a first reading for a change to the India Shrine bylaws for that \$15.00 increase at our July 14th Stated Session. The amendment will have a second reading, with discussion and vote at our September 8th Stated Session. We know we are asking a lot of you. No one hates Dues Increases more than I do, but please give the matter your earnest consideration. As we are all aware, our membership numbers are dropping every year. If we had a magic wand and could turn the membership numbers around to once again increase our size, these due increases would not be necessary. Among the other resolutions, there was a item that would have allowed E.A.'s and F.C. to petition the Shrine. This type of legislation is unacceptable, as it disrespects our Lodges. We are proud to report that it was overwhelmingly and very vocally defeated. On the upside, we voted to charter 2 new Temples at the session. One is in Brazil and the other is in Lebanon.

Nobles this month is CSSA month in Omaha, Nebraska. Omaha is always a fun time with a lot to do. For those that are going, be sure to check out the Hay Market District, which is similar to our Bricktown area.

As we get into August, be sure you stay hydrated, as August is usually the hottest month of the year in this part of the country!



Legislation Results for the 149th Annual Imperial Council Session The Iowa Corporation – Fraternal Side

Resolution #1 If passed, this would have allowed for a Roll Call that could be taken and verified using the electronic voting device. FAILED

Resolution #2 If passed, this would have allowed for 2 voting Representatives for Temples falling below 300 members, rather than 1 as is currently the rule. FAILED

Resolution #3 If passed, this would have allowed for Video attendance at an Imperial Session in the event of a National Shut down. FAILED

Resolution #4 If passed, this would have raised the Per capita Tax that Imperial charges the Temples for each member, from \$30 to \$60. This item failed, but was later brought back up for reconsideration and was amended to a \$20 increase, which was then APPROVED.

Resolution #5 If passed, this would have allowed Entered Apprentices and Fellow Crafts to Petition the Shrine. FAILED

Resolution #6 - Withdrawn

Resolution #7 If passed, this would have eliminated jurisdictional lines and allowed for a US Petitioner to Petition any Shrine Temple in the US, regardless of location. FAILED

Resolution #8 If passed, this would modify the current language pertaining to Holding Corporations and would allow for Temple Building Preservation Corporations. PASSED

Resolution #9 If passed, Headquarters would be required to furnish Shrine Associations with contact lists for the members of their Association Temples. PASSED

Resolution #10 If passed, would give Amal Shrine Exclusive Jurisdiction is the Republic of Brazilia. PASSED

Resolution #11 – Withdrawn

Resolution #12 If passed, would change the jurisdiction for Algeria Shrine from exclusive to concurrent with 3 other Temples. PASSED

Resolution #13 If passed, this would allow Morocco Shrine to move their Charter to their new address. PASSED

Resolution #14 If passed, would allow Melha Shrine to move their Charter to their new address. PASSED

Resolution #15 If passed, would allow Al Bedoo Shrine to move their Charter to the new address. PASSED

Resolution #16 If passed, would allow Al Chymia Shrine to move their Charter to their new address. PASSED

Resolution #17 If passed, would allow Al Koran Shrine to move their Charter to their new address. PASSED

Resolution #18 If passed, would allow Al Atfal Shrine to join the Western Shrine Association. PASSED

Resolution #19 If passed, would allow Al Atfal Shrine to join the Latin American Shrine Association. PASSED

Resolution #20 If passed, would allow Ben Ali Shrine to join the Pacific Northwest Shrine Association. PASSED

Resolution #21 If passed, would allow Asiya Shrine to join the Pacific Shrine Association. PASSED

Resolution #22 If passed, would allow Asiya Shrine to withdraw from the Western Shrine Association. PASSED

Resolution #23 If passed, would allow Anezah Shrine to join the Western Shrine Association. PASSED

Resolution #24 If passed, would allow Kerbela Shrine to join the Southeastern Shrine Association. PASSED

Resolution #25 If passed, would allow Anezah Shrine to withdraw from the Latin American Shrine Association. PASSED

Resolution #26 If passed, would allow El Kalah Shrine to withdraw from the Western Shrine Association. PASSED

Resolution #27 If passed, would allow Salah Shrine U.D. to be Chartered. PASSED

Resolution #28 If passed, would allow Lunnan Shrine U.D. to be Chartered. PASSED

In the election for Imperial Outer Guard, David C Hamm PP of Sharon Shrine was elected.

Legislation for Shriners Hospitals for Children The Colorado Corporation

Resolution #29

If passed, would have allows the Annual Session to be held by Video Conferencing in the event of a National Emergency. FAILED

Resolution #30

If passed, the oversight committee would be continued with the Chairman of the Board of Directors appointing the Chairman and 3 additional members. PASSED

In the Trustee Elections, Leslie Stewart, Ken Guidera and Timothy Ludwig were elected to 3 year terms.
