The Importance of the Shrine Clubs By Darrell J David

The membership of India Shrine covers much of Oklahoma. Many members live near Oklahoma City and in the surrounding areas. However, Shriners are also found in far western and southern areas of the state. Traveling to Oklahoma City to participate in meetings and activities may not always be convenient for those who live in outlying areas, which makes our shrine clubs a valuable part of the membership. The shrine center is fortunate to have various clubs in many locations around the state.

The Panhandle Shrine Club gathers for dinner on a quarterly schedule in Guymon. The club started in 1992 and currently has less than 10 members. Although small, the group makes donations to the transportation fund and helps out when local needs arise in their community. The club is currently taking donations for a Winchester 12-gauge shotgun to be given away on November 22nd.

In Altus, the shrine club meets at Western Sizzlin the last Tuesday of the month. The group has 21 members of varying ages from Harmon, Jackson & Greer counties. Meetings are held in conjunction with the Swokies Unit. The men participate in area parades and sell onions and circus tickets. The group also helps address community needs when they arise if possible.

The Duncan Shrine Club is comprised of men ages 40 into their 90s. They meet the first Monday of each month at Masonic Lodge #60 in Duncan at 809 W Chestnut Ave. This club has been meeting since 1952 and has 31 members. Besides helping to sell onions each year, in June the club hosts a family day at Waurika Lake. They invite all of the blue lodges in District 34 and their families to participate in a cookout and swimming. Through activities such as this the club is starting to have new members join. The men also participate in parades in their area at Christmas and for the 4th of July.

The Murray County Shrine Club is a 26-member unit. Two of those members are currently serving as a Potentate's Aide. The club strives to be very active in all temple activities and works diligently to share information about India Shriners when possible. The group participates in parades. However, their favorite activities are fundraising and serving their community. Every year the Murray County Shrine Club is the top seller for the Tax Relief giveaway event held each April in conjunction with the Ardmore Shrine Club. They are also a top selling club at the temple's annual fall 75-gun raffle. The men also participate in selling onions and circus tickets. At Halloween and Christmas carnivals in their area the group offers picture buttons with "Fezzy in a Jeep" and participates in any other opportunities available. Meetings are held the last Thursday of each month at 2249 E Main Street in Davis. If you are looking for a group to join they would love for you to reach out to them.

The third Monday of each month the Ardmore Shrine Club meets at the Elks Lodge, 2526 S Commerce, in Ardmore at 7:30 p.m. This group is trying to encourage activity from new members and is exploring purchasing some type of parade vehicles for the club to enable members to be more active. Each spring the men help host a barbecue cook-off competition and work with the Murray County Shrine Club to organize the annual Tax Relief giveaway in Ardmore. Once a month they go out to eat with their wives and other family members.

The Central Oklahoma Shrine Club meets the fourth Thursday in Edmond at Alfredo's Mexican Café on W 33rd Street. Dinner is at 6 p.m. and the meeting follows at 7 p.m. This club was established 23 years ago and is now made of mostly of retired gentlemen who enjoy connecting with the other members. However, anyone is welcome.

Other clubs include: the Lawton-FT Sill Club that meets on the third Tuesday of each month and the Ada Club whose meetings are the first Tuesday each month.
