Recorders Remarks

Nobles, the Gun Raffle is here or just finished up, depending on when you read this. All indications are that it was a very successful Fund Raiser and a very fun time for those who attended.

Your elected Representatives have just returned from the Imperial Council Session. There were several changes that have taken place and we have 3 new Shrine Temples that were approved. All are outside of the US. The only item that really affects us is a formula for increasing the Per Capita that we pay to Headquarters every year. This formula is based on any changes in the Consumer Price Index and any changes in our membership numbers. This formula does limit how much of an increase we can expect in the annual Per Capita tax that we pay to Imperial. While we are not a fan of increases in per capita, because they increase the amount of our dues, this does regulate them. Per Capita tax is the only income that Imperial has. Losses in membership affects their bottom line tremendously. The way that we can offset and turn this around is to turn our membership numbers around and have positive gains rather than losses every year. India for example has not had a gain in membership since 2010! That is a significant loss of members and dues income. Perhaps we should look around more closely for some new members. We also know that the Blue Lodge is where that happens first. So let's get busy and turn this ship around for our Lodges, our Rite Bodies and our Shrine!

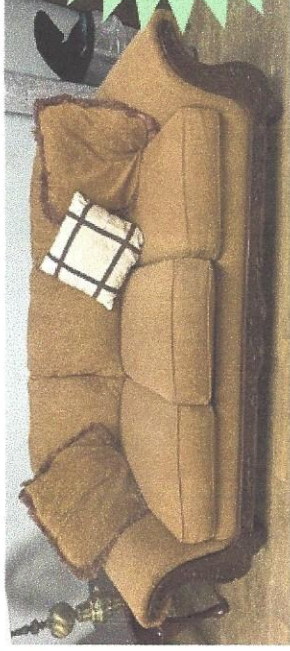

One again I would like to thank everyone for their hard work and contributions to making this a successful year. We hope to see everyone at CSSA!!

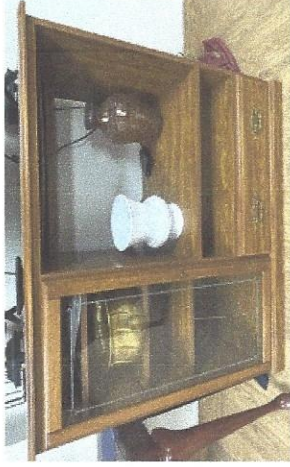

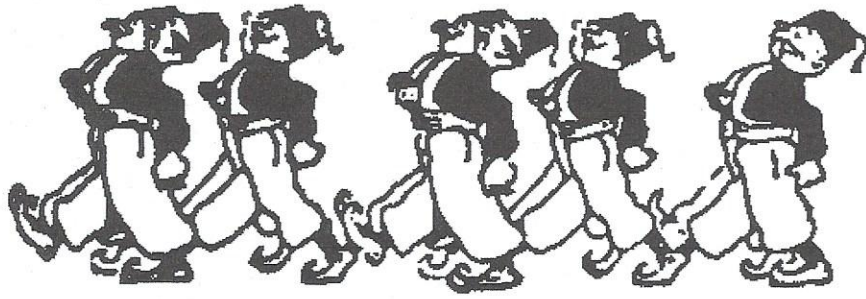

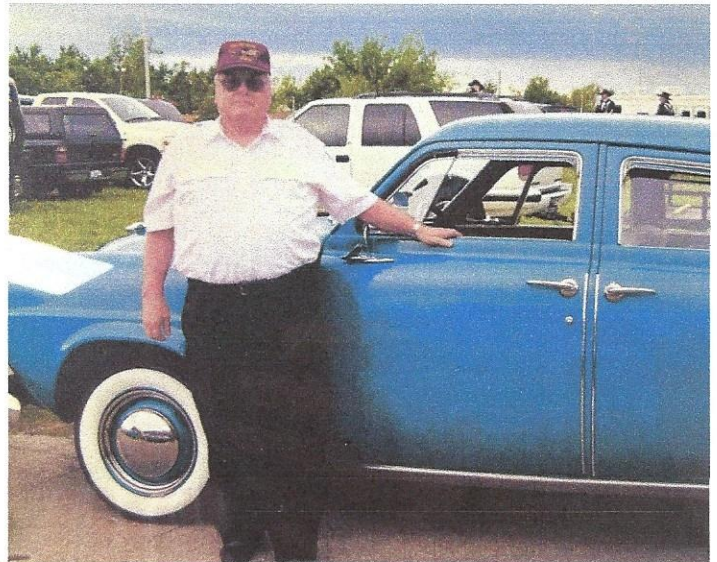
